

Chicago Style 17th Edition (Author-Date)

- List sources at end of paper on a new page under the heading “References”
- List sources alphabetically, single-spaced with a space between each entry, and hanging indentation
- Multiple sources from the same author or group of authors are listed chronologically based on the publication date. After first source where authors’ names are repeated, replace the authors’ names with a long dash (——), which can be created by inserting three em-dashes
- If an author appears first among several on a source, any single-author entries by the same person are listed above the joint publication, regardless of date
- If the same author has the same more than one publication in the same year, list alphabetically according to title and add a, b, c after date
- If author is unknown, the note and bibliography entries begin with the title of the newspaper*
- Add type of internet source if unclear (e.g., blog, podcast, video), and add access date if no publication date or update date is available**
