Level 1 Heading


Notice that the level 1 heading has capital letters for all words except articles, prepositions, and conjunctions. It is also bolded and left-justified. Use level 1 headings only if you have at least one other level 1 heading. The text under this heading begins in a new paragraph and therefore begins with an indent.

Level 2 Heading

Notice that the level 2 heading has capital letters for all words except articles, prepositions, and conjunctions. It is also left-justified. It is not bolded, nor is it italicized. Use level 2 headings only if you have at least one other level 2 heading within a section. The text under this heading begins in a new paragraph and therefore begins with an indent.
