

Draft Terms of Reference for 2020-21 Remote Teaching and Learning (Online) Preparedness Taskforce

Mandate: to lead StFX efforts toward preparations for the 2020 fall-term delivery of remote teaching and learning programming, should such distance education programming be necessary due to the on-going COVID-19 health crisis.

Objective: The Taskforce will bring together stakeholders from across the University including faculty, other teaching staff, support staff and students, to explore the challenges of moving to an online teaching and learning format, and to advise the Academic Vice-President with respect to the necessary steps required to be able to do so. The Taskforce will address such questions as:

- What professional development experiences including workshops, may be required by faculty and others to assist in the move to an online teaching and learning approach?
- What technologies would be best for on-line delivery of StFX courses to account for different pedagogies?
- How might our existing online teaching and learning expertise of faculty and staff be best exploited for assisting faculty and other teaching staff who are untrained in this area?
- How would the face-to-face labs components of courses be conducted in a virtual teaching setting?
- How might online assessments including invigilated tests and exams, be conducted in such an environment?
- What resources, human/technological or otherwise, might we need to allow us to be prepared for, and capable of, delivering online T/L programming?
