ABSTRACT: The trend for art making among youth today comes from a visual culture that struggles to fit traditional definitions of art. Art education programs need to include broader notions of artistic development (Kindler, 2003). Kindler stated, the importance of visual culture in the educational world can be seen in the art created by today's children, often through cartoon or manga drawings. This type of art, says Kindler, is created as a result of how children experience the world through media and is often disregarded as art. It is thought to be immature and simplistic yet, as Kindler points out, there must be a need for it, or children would not be engaging in this type of art making. She suggests children have a need to represent, communicate, and share ideas and thoughts significant to them. This need is what quides their desire to create.
