Important Information:

- All students intending to graduate must apply to do so. The application to graduate is located in your personalized mesAMIS account. Please note that a student cannot be considered a candidate for graduation unless an application has been submitted.
- Please note: Students enrolled in fall term courses are not eligible for Fall Convocation.
- Registration for winter and spring remains opened to all eligible students. If you have not done so we ask that you register as soon as possible. July saw a busy and diverse summer school program! Approximately 100 graduate students came to Xavier Hall to complete courses. Graduate students new to the program successfully juggled issues of commuting to Antigonish, arranging childcare, entertaining visiting family 'from away', managing a myriad of family responsibilities all while studying! Although it is challenging for some graduate students to come onto campus for face-to-face courses in July, by the end of summer classes most students agreed on the power of the learning community that is created in the face-to-face environment. There was wonderful geographic diversity in the program with students coming to StFX from almost every province and territory in Canada and others coming from other countries, making for rich learning conversations. The beautiful summer weather in Antigonish enhanced the learning environment. Students continuing in the program came on-campus to take courses in qualitative research methods, research literacy, using social media in the classroom,

building positive relationships in classrooms using Tribes, and understanding and addressing mental health issues in schools. Graduate students in the French resource cohort, the Tri-country Leadership, Physical Education and Literacy cohorts were participating in courses on-site in Halifax and Yarmouth. Other non-cohort students came in to courses offered fully on-line. All of this speaks to the wonderful professionals in our Masters program who are committed to lifelong learning!
