Physics Society Tutorials are free tutorials for students in first-year physics courses. They are a volunteer service provided by The Physics Society and are offered as a drop-in event. Typically, 1-2 volunteers serve as tutors and wait for first-year students to drop by an assigned classroom at a given time (once weekly for 1-2 hours on an evening). Normally, no more than 2-3 first-year students will be simultaneously present simultaneously. During the COVID-19 pandemic, tutors and students will be required to follow the safety procedures below.

1. No more than 2 tutors and 4 students will be simultaneously present in the assigned classroom.
2. Tutors will be seated at least 3 meters apart. Students will maintain physical distancing (2-meter separation) unless they are talking to a tutor. Tutors and students will be required to wear non-medical masks at all times during the tutorial. Non-medical masks will be provided in case a student forgets their mask.
3. When a student talks to a tutor, 2-meter separation will be maintained except for short periods of time when it may be necessary to share written information. Student and tutor will avoid touching the same items (such as a student's homework or pencil).
4. Participants will sanitize their hands when entering and leaving the room. They have the option to wipe their seat and table prior to sitting down with wipes provided in the classroom.
5. Students will not eat, drink, or remove their mask in the tutorial.

NOTE: All tools and equipment shall be used in accordance with provincial OH&S legislation, manufacturer's specifications, applicable standards and codes of practice.
