



Part Time Academic Instructor (CSCI 522) Department of Computer Science, Faculty of Science

Position Description

The Department of Computer Science invites applications for a part-time Academic Instructor to teach **CSCI 522 (High Performance Computing)** (3 credits) during the Winter term of the 2023-2024 academic year.

This course is designed for graduate level parallel computing courses. This is not only a course which is linked to real parallel programming software, but also a course which covers many theoretical aspects on architectures, algorithms and applications. This course concentrates on parallel program to be executed not only on special multiprocessor systems or supercomputers, but also on networked workstations (Linux) or PCs using freely available parallel software tools such as Message Passing Interface (MPI) and Parallel Virtual Machine (PVM). Some emerging topics such as cluster computing, grid computing, cloud computing, peer- to-peer computing, as well as multicore systems will be introduced.

Applicants should hold a PhD in Computer Science or a closely related field and/or related practical experience in computer application technology and in data analytics. The candidates must show a strong commitment to teaching.

About the Department

The Department of Computer Science offers undergraduate programs (Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science). We support many undergraduates in summer research projects, funded by programs such as NSERC USRAs. We offer a research-based MSc program, and the research activity in Computer Science at StFX has received high rankings by Macleans' magazine. The Department has also recently launched a new course-based Master's of Applied Computer Science as well as a post-Baccalaureate Diploma in Artificial Intelligence to complement other undergraduate degrees. The candidate will have the opportunity to contribute to the continued growth, direction and success of the new programs in the department.
