Overview

Key Responsibilities

- The successful applicant will possess 3rd Class Nova Scotia Power Engineer Certificate.
- Experience operating large heavy oil-fired steam boilers in a Safe manner.
- Experience with computerized boiler control systems as well as experience in the maintenance of plant equipment.
- Typical duties include monitoring equipment and process conditions taking corrective action as required.
- Additional duties include water quality testing, chemical treatment of boiler water, reception of oil deliveries, safe work permitting, coordination with visitors, suppliers and contractors.
- Strong skills in problem solving, decision making, and planning is required.

Qualifications

- High School Grade 12 or equivalent.
- Nova Scotia Power Engineer Class 3 certificate
- Experience in skilled tradesman work & in building maintenance.
- Ability to perform all duties peculiar to and normally required in the classification(s), following accepted procedures and techniques for such work.
- Skilled in the use and maintenance of hand and power tools and equipment.
- Skilled in the reading of schematic drawings, charts, blueprints, and technical instructions.
- Ability to perform semi-skilled work in areas other than those covered under own certificate of qualification.
- Knowledge of regulatory codes and requirements and be safety certified.
- Ability to apply formulas and conversion tables to job requirements.
- Ability to perform basic computer data input.
- Ability to perform related duties as assigned.
