Step 1:


- Review the list of articles your professor has provided.
- Highlight the title of each article.
- In this example, the name of the article is: "Use of formative research to develop a yoga curriculum for high-risk youth: Implementation considerations"

- From the main search box, enter the title of the article, and select the search button


You will be brought to the following screen. Select the "Find Online" button
