Position Description

The Biology Department invites applications for a part time (20 hours per week) Laboratory Instructor. The term of the appointment is from August 12, 2024 to May 9, 2025.

Minimum qualifications are a B.Sc. in Biology or related field. Experience in instructing undergraduate laboratories is desirable, and higher education or equivalent work experience would be an asset.

The successful candidate will undertake laboratory instruction and associated tasks for the undergraduate course Human Kinetics 151 and 152, Applied Human Anatomy and Physiology I and II, which is required for all BA and BSc students majoring in Human Kinetics. The Department is seeking candidates who are committed to contributing to StFX's priorities of equity, diversity, and inclusion. Demonstrated ability in fostering a climate of inclusion in the classroom and attracting underrepresented groups of students to the program is an asset.

The successful candidate should employ an equitable, diverse, inclusive, and accessible teaching approach to promote a respectful environment for all students, staff, and faculty.
