



Nurse Educator Rankin School of Nursing Probationary Appointment

Position Description

St. Francis Xavier University Rankin School of Nursing invites applications for a Nurse Educator (Probationary Appointment) to commence on August 1, 2024. After (3) years and upon positive annual evaluations, this probationary appointment will be considered for a continuing (or permanent) appointment.

The successful candidate will have experience in planning, implementing, and evaluating theoretical learning experiences for nursing students. The responsibilities for these positions include planning and supervising learning experiences, grading assignments, and completing performance evaluations for nursing students in the clinical setting, Simulation Learning Centre, and Skills Laboratory. Experience with interactive teaching strategies at the undergraduate level is also required as well as the ability to work collaboratively with others. The candidate must have experience in Mental Health Nursing. The successful candidate will have a demonstrated commitment to professional nursing.

The successful candidate must be registered with the Nova Scotia College of Nurses (NSCN) Nova Scotia prior to commencement of the position, have a Master's Degree, and have at least five years full-time clinical teaching experience. Registered Nurses with a strong practice background, with a BScN degree, will be considered but will be required to complete a Master's Degree Program during the probationary period. We are seeking candidates with a strong background in Medical Surgical Nursing.
