

FLUORESCENT BULBS Safe Operating Procedure Updated March 2022

SAFE WORK PRACTICES

- Do not perform the procedure or operate the equipment until you have been appropriately trained and authorized to do so by your supervisor.
- Inspect required personal protective equipment (PPE) and replace if required.
- Wear fitted respirator with P100 filters when dealing with multiple tubes.

CHANGING BULBS PROCEDURES

- 1. Set up step ladder.
- 2. Turn off switch, install switch lock.
- 3. Remove light cover/shade and put in safe place.
- 4. Remove tubes (one at a time).
- 5. Place used tubes in storage box.
- 6. Install new tubes (one at a time).
- 7. Wipe down cover/shade with damp cloth
- 8. Replace cover/shade on fixture.
- 9. Remove switch lockout.
- 10. Turn on switch to check lights.
- 11. Clean up site, place ladder and box of tubes in storage.
- 12. When used storage box is full, call Grounds & Transportation for pick up.
- 13. If tube accidently breaks, see **Broken Bulbs Procedures** below for proper clean up.

BROKEN BULBS PROCEDURES

- 1. Have people leave area until cleanup is complete.
- 2. Open window in room (if applicable).
- 3. Shut off mechanical air system (if applicable).
- 4. Do not use vacuum to clean up broken tubes/bulbs.
- 5. Scoop up pieces of glass and powder with stiff paper and place in sealed bag.
- 6. Use duct tape to clean up any remaining fragments and place tape in sealed bag.
- 7. Wipe area clean with damp paper towels and place in sealed bag.

- 8. For carpet surface, vacuum area after all visible materials are removed.
- 9. Place vacuum bag in sealed plastic bag.
- 10. Label sealed plastic bag as hazardous waste.
- 11. Wash hands with soap and water.
- 12. Call Grounds & Transportation to pick up hazardous waste.
