ASYNCHRONOUS TEACHING

SKILL BUILDING ACTIVITIES



- Cover material in manageable 'chunks' to facilitate students' success and to allow them to take frequent breaks
- Create opportunities to provide feedback early and often through assessment and interactive activities

INSPIRE ACTIVE ENGAGEMENT

- 'Chunking' content provides the opportunity for active learning
- Choose when and how students pause to apply what they are learning
 - may involve a quiz, reflection questions, problem solving, etc.



CREATE SHORT AUDIO CLIPS (3-5 MIN)



- Explain difficult concepts
- May or may not involve slides or pictures
- Students can revisit to reinforce their learning and use as a study tool
- May include video, but does not have to

INCLUDE SHORT VIDEOS (5-10 MIN)

- Prior to asking students to watch the video, explain the intent for watching - focus on a key concept or specific skill set
 - for example "you should be able to provide the answer to "



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SHARE SCRIPT OF AUDIO & VIDEO CLIPS

- Ensures presentation covers what was intended
- Allows students to read along as they listen
- Also serves as a study tool

FOLLOW UP ACTIVITIES

Design worksheets, assignments, quizzes, group discussions, games, etc. to supplement the 'chunks' of material allowing students to engage with the material in several ways
