



Option 1: Using the Whiteboard feature

- Open the Collaborate Panel.
- Open the Share Content Panel.
- Choose the Share Whiteboard feature and the whiteboard will appear on the screen.



Whiteboard tools

Mark on shared content

When moderators share a blank whiteboard they want to collaborate with you. Use Collaborate's editing and markup tools to participate.



Moderators may also choose to allow participants to mark up their shared file during a session in their session settings. Look for the editing tools to collaborate.

Use these tools to edit and mark up shared files and the whiteboard.

Tool	Description
Select	Use the arrow to select an object on the whiteboard. After you select it you can resize, move, and delete it.
Pointer	Use the hand to point to different areas of the visible slide. Attendees see wherever you are pointing on the slide.

Whiteboard tools

Pencil	Use the pencil to draw free hand on the slide.
Shapes	Use the <i>Shapes</i> icon to draw a rectangle, ellipse, or a straight line. Your choice.
Text	Type text on the slide with the "T".
Clear	Use <i>Clear</i> to undo everything.

Option 2: Adding blank slides to your PPT presentation.

- When an instructor creates their class PPT they can add blank slides throughout the presentation to fill the role of the Whiteboard
- When PPT slides are saved as PDF files they automatically become slides that can be annotated with the Whiteboard tools.
- Including blank slides as needed throughout their PPT presentation works in the same way as a whiteboard. This method can save time as we no longer have to end our presentation to insert the Whiteboard
 - Please note the information on either Whiteboard version is not saved without further manipulation (I.e., screen shot or some other tool).
